Accessible Entrance

There is step-free access to the Trinity building with automatic doors that open outwards, and a handrail on the right from the pavement to the front door as you come in.

There is an intercom buzzer for the Metal office outside the main door, about 1m from ground height.



Access Ramps

There is step-free access to the Trinity building.

There are no internal access ramps in the Trinity building



All-Gender Accessible Toilet

There is one all-gender accessible toilet on the ground floor of the main Trinity building. The toilet has a hand rail and emergency cord.

We do not have a Changing Places Toilet.



Baby Changing, Feeding Facilities, and Buggy Parking

There are no designated baby changing facilities or baby changing units in the Trinity building.

Metal staff can find a space in the building for you to use for this purpose, or we direct you to an alternative public building, or arrange a meeting in a space with this facility if that is better.

We can find a quiet space at Trinity for you to bottle or breast feed your baby and you may use our kitchen to prepare any food or bottles.

There is space available inside the building to park a buggy.

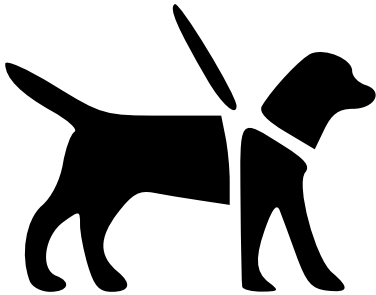
Accessible Lifts



There are two lifts in the Trinity building. The entrance to the lift doorways are 840mm wide. The floor space in the lift is 1215mm x 1470mm.

The lifts stop at all floors of the Trinity building and there are no internal steps or ramps on any floor.

Guide and Assistance Dogs



Trinity Building Peterborough is a guide dog and assistance dog friendly building.

We can provide water for your guide or assistance dog.

Hearing loop and BSL interpreters



We do not have a hearing loop at the Trinity building.

We can provide a BSL interpreter for our live events on request.

We may be able to provide SignVideo, Sign Solutions, TranslateLive at our online events on request.

Chill/ Sensory/ Safe/ Quiet/ Warm Space, Prayer Room



We do not have a designated chill/ sensory/ safe/ quiet space or prayer room at the Trinity building.

We can find a space for any of these needs if it is helpful. Please talk to us about what would be helpful.

We do not have sensory toys or equipment, but are happy for people to bring their own sensory toys to use when they need to.

This building is neither a designated Safer Places building nor a designated Warm Welcome Space building, but staff can direct you to local services.

Free Sanitary Products



We have a small range of free sanitary products. Please speak to a member of Metal staff if you need any sanitary products.

There is a sanitary product dispenser in the female toilet on the first floor of the Trinity building. This is not free.

Travelling by Train



Trinity suites is just under a 10-minute walk from Peterborough Train Station.

This station has step-free access to all platforms, and at the main entrance.

Travelling by Bus



Queensgate Bus Station is a 5 minute walk from the Trinity building.

Travelling by Car



There is no on-site parking at the Trinity building, but nearby parking options include:

- Wentworth Street
(4 minute walk, £1.50 for 1 hour up to £8 for 24 hours)
Disabled Parking Bays are situated outside the entrance to Wentworth Street Car Park.
- Pleasure Fair Meadows
(14 minute walk, £2.50 for 1 hour up to £6 for 24 hours).

Both of these parking facilities have disabled parking spaces available.

Other Facilities – Food, Drink, Kitchen Area

There is a small kitchen area in the corridor opposite the Metal office. Visitors can use any of the facilities and equipment to make drinks and light refreshments. We kindly ask that you clean up after using any of the items in the kitchen. Metal caters vegetarian/vegan for all events.

There is water, tea, coffee, and milk available for visitors to use.



Other Facilities- Cloak Room

There is a coat rack in the office. You are welcome to leave your coat there. Please note items are not monitored.



Other Facilities – Local Amenities

The Trinity Hub is just on the edge of the town centre. There are a range of shops, places to eat and public facilities around the town, all within a short distance of the office. Please ask a member of the team if you are looking for something specific and they can help direct you.



In An Emergency

If the fire alarm sounds, staff will direct you out of the building using the nearest fire escape route.

If you have a PEEP, your appointed support person will help you.

The Fire Assembly points are in the car park opposite the Trinity Building.
