

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About Metal

Our work

Metal champions the right for artists, creatives and curious people to follow hunches, explore dreams and probe problems through creativity to inspire positive change.

In the last ten years, we've supported over 11,000 artists, hosted over 110,000 participants and welcomed over 8 million audience members. Metal's artist alumni include Assemble, Beverley Bennett, Delaine La Bas, Elsa James, Kate Marsh, Khaleb Brooks, Lucy + Jorge Orta, Steve Reich, Tim Burrows and many more.

As well as nationally and internationally, we currently work in Liverpool, Peterborough and Southend-on-Sea. We were invited to these places by local authorities, Arts Council England and other partners. All our work is underpinned by practice-based research themes related to the specific and necessary concerns of each place, from urban biodiversity in Liverpool to food and farming in Peterborough, and creative education in Essex.

Our current programme includes: The Unlonely City, disrupting loneliness over 10 years by nurturing moments of solidarity, surprise and laughter in UK cities; Shift, Liverpool's network of 60+ cultural organisations addressing the climate crisis; Creative Break Time, supporting Southend teachers' creativity with TOMA and Focal Point Gallery; Positive Notes, reshaping perceptions of Peterborough; and membership of the Citizens in Power Network.



About the role

We are looking for a creative, flexible and inspiring Producer to support the Director and wider Metal team with production, logistics and administration, playing a key role in shaping our future artistic programme and deepening our impact in our neighbourhood, across Liverpool and the wider region.

You will be highly organised and experienced in managing budgets and working with artists to support their ideas and development. This role suits someone who enjoys working in a team, building relationships across sectors, from local communities and artists to civic, environmental and cultural organisations.

This is an exciting time to join Metal, following the launch of our new collaborative strategy in 2024, working across our three sites, which focuses on being responsive to the needs of artists and communities while addressing long-term societal and environmental change.

We are seeking someone with a passion for climate sustainability and creative practice, eager to explore how art can drive climate justice, resilience and local transformation. You will co-chair Shift, Liverpool's network supporting climate action and low-carbon practice in the arts, and help embed environmental responsibility across Metal's programmes and partnerships.

This role offers the opportunity to contribute to Metal's national programme, connecting Liverpool's work with our sites in Southend and Peterborough, and sharing creative approaches that inspire positive change. This position is based onsite at Edge Hill Station, Liverpool.

About our team

Metal's work is brought to life by local creatives and producers who understand the complexities of each place. Many of us have community roles and artistic practices outside of our day jobs (spoken word, youth work, painting, writing and more). Celebrating difference is important to Metal and global majority, disabled, LGBTQIA+ and working-class people are represented in our leadership. We are a small, collaborative and creative <u>team</u>. There is a sense of fun and openness to working with Metal. Our supportive <u>Board</u>, chaired by Andrea Stark, has experience from across the cultural sector.


Our buildings



Job Description

Development and Delivery of Programme

- Support the development, planning and delivery programmes including timelines, administration and logistics. Leading a portfolio of programmes and projects;
- Work closely with the Director, Liverpool and CEO / AD, to support artist development and develop creative programme ideas;
- Work closely with the Director, Liverpool to support existing community partnerships, cross-sector partnerships and cultivate new relationships;
- Manage and monitor detailed individual project budgets, keeping accurate financial information, in consultation with Director, Liverpool, Executive Director and Finance Manager.
- Actively seek to build and diversify audiences, partnerships and community collaborations, working with Metal's SMT to achieve our aims for inclusion, equity and diversity;
- Working with Head of Programmes and Partnerships, SMT and the wider Metal team to support the development of new national programmes which support the overall vision and strategic aims of Metal;
- Manage staff and volunteers, as required.



Job Description

Fundraising, Reporting and Evaluation

- Work closely with the Director, Liverpool, CEO/AD and Exec Director on all areas of fundraising and income generation, leading applications and nurturing opportunities for your projects;
- Report to funders, providing quantitive and qualitative evaluation on projects that you are leading on.
- Work with the Director, and the wider team to develop effective evaluation plans and audience development plans for Metal Liverpool.
- Contribute to reporting of Metal nationally feeding statistics into reports, ensuring that artists participants and audiences complete evaluation and feedback.

Climate and Environmental Responsibility

- Lead and champion Metal Liverpool's commitment to environmental sustainability and climate action across all projects and operations;
- Along with the Director, Liverpool, Co-chair Shift Liverpool's network supporting climate action and low-carbon practices in the arts. Planning and delivering the programme;
- Collaborate with artists, partners and communities to develop creative projects that explore climate justice, resilience and environmental transformation.
- Monitor and share learning on sustainable practice, contributing to Metal's organisational development and sector-wide advocacy.
- Work with the Metal team in Southend and Peterborough to exchange ideas and models for environmentally responsible working and creative practice.



Job Description

Communications

- Lead on developing and delivering effective communications plans for Metal Liverpool and contribute to the Metal UK national channels working closely with the MarComms Manager;
- Create inspiring content (e.g. text, video, images) to support press, marketing and online engagement;
- Lead Metal Liverpool's social media with the Marcomms Manager and update channels and website.

Other Duties

- Act as an advocate for Metal, in terms of hospitality, generosity, access and care for staff, artists, audiences and the wider public;
- Work within Metal's policies. Actively seek to implement Metal's Equal opportunities policies, safeguarding, financial procedures and health and safety policies.
- Work collaboratively with the wider Metal team sharing practice and learning;
- Undertake any other duties reasonably requested by SMT and board of trustees.

- Warm, friendly and open with genuine enjoyment of working with a cross-section of people;
- Experience of producing or similar role in culture/arts/education;
- Experience of arts project management including fundraising, evaluation, budgets, administration, event management and logistics;
- Experience in developing creative programming and supporting artists;
- Experience of working with and cultivating new relationships and partnerships with community groups and cross-sector organisations;
- Passionate about arts and culture, climate sustainability and environmental practices;
- Creative problem solver who is calm under pressure;
- Experience creating safe and inclusive spaces for public events;
- Excellent communications skills and ability to promote and market programmes for different audiences including social media;
- Strong attention to detail;
- Ability to multi-task, delegate and prioritise within a busy working environment;
- Confident working independently but also as part of a small team;
- Excellent IT skills including Microsoft Office

4 day working week: At Metal, we operate a 4-day working week. This policy reduces the standard full-time working week from five to four days, with no loss of pay — and applies proportionally to part-time roles to support flexibility and wellbeing for all staff.


